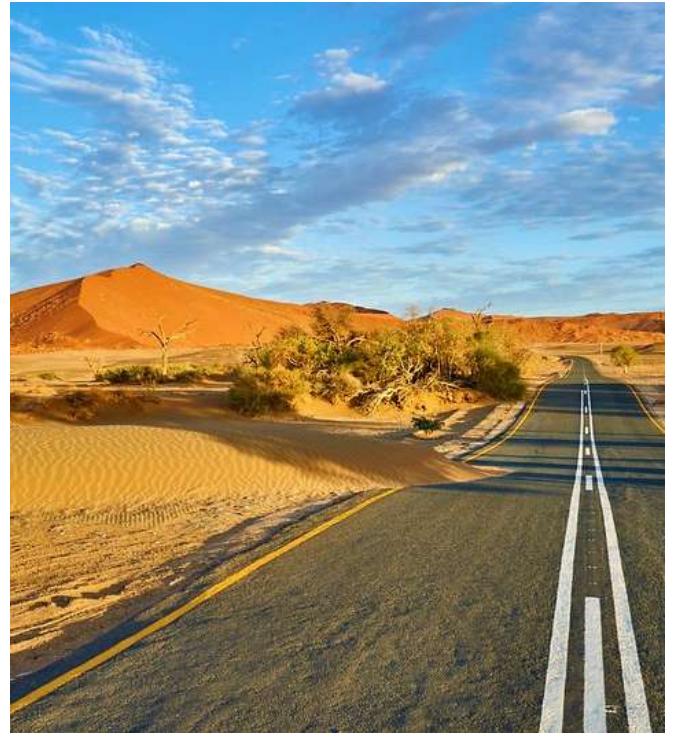

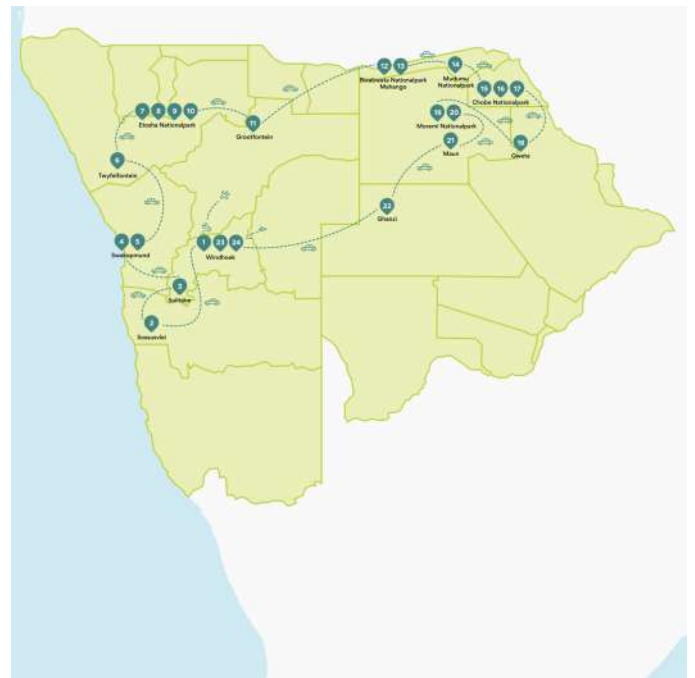
Day 2

Private transfer: about 310km and 3.5 hours

Accommodation: Sesriem Oshana Campsite

Next, Sossusvlei, the highest dune in the world, awaits you. A natural beauty in the heart of Namibia, it has a lot to offer. The sand mountains rise with heights of up to 300 meters and surround the "Vlei", the mostly dry river, only in rainy years you can find water in the salt-clay pan. It has been a UNESCO World Heritage Site of the Namib Sand Sea since 2013. Despite the living conditions, for example, spitbuck, desert gold mule or even the puff adder find their home here. (B/-/-)



Day 3

The second steepest pass in the country! (Sprietshotage Pass)

Private transfer: about 115km and 1.5 hours

Accommodation: Camp Gecko Camping

The Namib Desert and the Khomas Highland are connected by one of the most beautiful and at the same time steepest mountain passes in Namibia. The pass meanders over the Great Escarpment with gradients of up to 22 percent. Here, more than 1,676 meters in altitude are overcome. This makes the pass the fifth highest pass in the country. At the top of the pass there is a viewpoint with a magnificent view of the Namib Desert.

Day 4 & 5

Adventure and relaxing at the Atlantic Coast (Swakopmund)

Private transfer: about 370 km and 4.5 hours

Accommodation: Sea Breeze Guesthouse

Today you go to the beautiful sea of Namibia! On your drive to relax on the sandy beach, however, there are still a few highlights waiting for you that are definitely worth a stop. Before you set off you could visit the impressive Sesriem Canyon. After you have started today's route, after about an hour's drive, the small settlement of Solitaire is waiting for you. There is a very well-known bakery there where you can take a break. In addition, if necessary, you should take the last chance to fill up here. As you continue your journey, you will cross the Namib-

Naukluft National Park. Then it's off to the coast, with the first location Walvis Bay, there you can see thousands of Flamigos on the coast. From there you can then enjoy a ride along the coast to Swakopmund. Arrived in the former German colony, a fantastically beautiful bathing beach awaits you, where you can completely relax and enjoy the sun's rays. Swakopmund is a beautiful place that offers you not only colonial architecture but also a great selection of coffees and restaurants. Optionally you can book a canoe tour or the Living Desert Tour. Day 6

Millennia-old history (Twyfelfontein)

Private transfer: about 330 km and 4 hours

Accommodation: Mowani Mountain Camp Campsite

Today's journey takes you further north, starting with a 50-minute drive along the coast to Henties Bay. Enjoy the view of the dreamy sea again before heading back into the equally impressive nature of the interior. You cross the Omaruru River, which only flows in the rainy season. If you want, you can stop at the rather quiet place. On your further way you will also cross the Tsiseb Conservancy, a nature reserve where you will find not only the highest mountain in Namibia but also breathtaking nature and many wild animals. Thousands of years of history await you in Twyfelfontein! Marvel at the seemingly endless rock carvings and rock paintings of the National Monument that date back to the Stone Age. For reasons of security and protection of the World Heritage Site, visits are only carried out in the company of a guide. A visit to the Damara Living Museum, a place where you can get to know and remember Namibia's indigenous people, the Damara, is particularly recommended. You will immerse yourself in the fascinating culture and make an important contribution to the Damara community. (B/-/D)



Day 7

Etosha National Park (Okaukuejo)

Private transfer: about 310 km and 4 hours

Accommodation: Okaukuejo Campsite

Today we go to one of the most important sights in Namibia, the Etosha National Park in Okaukuejo. There is the famous water hole where you can marvel at the wildlife up close. You have a direct view of it from your accommodation and can see elephants, rhinos, hyenas or lions, for example. You can also enjoy the beautiful sunset. (B/-/-)

Day 11

Marvel at the gigantic meteorite (Grootfontein)

Private transfer: about 220 km and 2.5 hours

Accommodation: Roy's Restcamp Campsite

Today you continue to Grootfontein, on your way you have the opportunity to visit the beautiful Guinassee with a minimal detour. Also, about halfway along the journey is the town of Tsumeb, which you can stop at if you wish. In Grootfontein there is a museum that you can visit if you are interested. It is also particularly recommended to drive to the Hoba Meteorite, just outside of Grootfontein. It weighs an astounding 60 tons and is the largest meteorite discovered on Earth to date. (B/-/-)

Bwabwata National Park Mahango

Accommodation: Nunda River Campsite

Look forward to visit the most unique national park in Namibia! On your journey you have the opportunity to take a break halfway in Rundu and relax a bit. Rundu is the second largest city in Namibia after Windhoek and at the same time a very young city. She is known for her beautiful wood carvings, which you can also view or purchase at the market of the Mbungura Woodcraft Cooperative if you wish. After you have completed the second half of your journey, the fantastically beautiful Bwabwata National Park awaits you. Wonderful green landscapes and a rich animal world are waiting for you. There are also several villages, which makes the park distinctly different from others. Bwabwata plays a crucial role in elephant conservation, home to one third of all gentle giants living in Namibia. The habitat is also very important for many other animals and you can look forward to great animal observations and of course pure nature! It is also a clear recommendation to visit the amazing Khwe Living Museum. (B/-/-)

Tag 14

The tropics of Namibia! (Mudumu National Park)

Private transfer: about 220 km and 2,5 Stunden

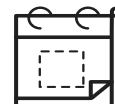

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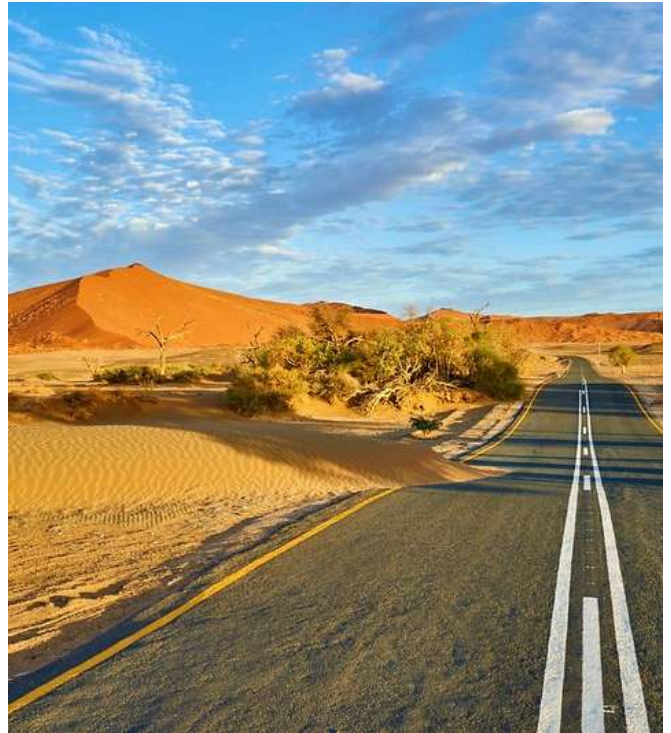

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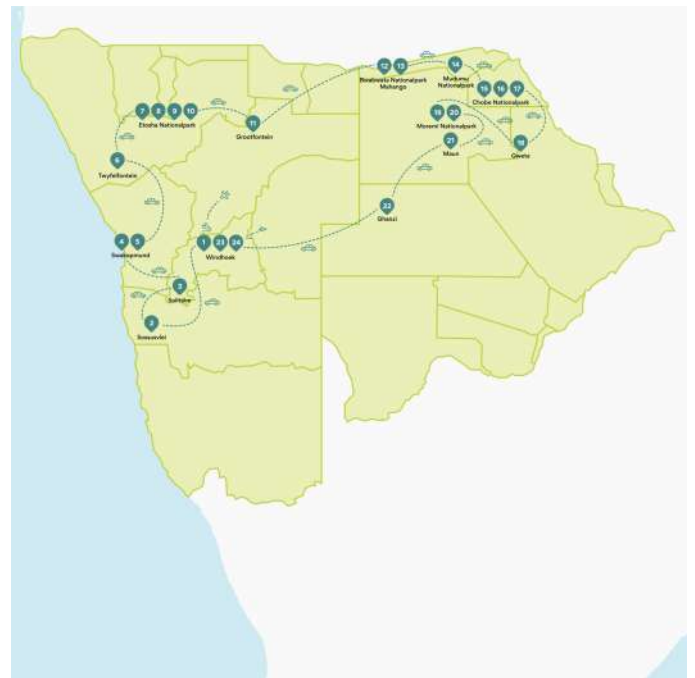
